Street Pastors Salisbury

Salisbury Street Pastors is part of a national scheme, training and supporting volunteers to care for people late at night in the city centre. The project focused on preventing crime particularly anti-social behaviour and violence to women and girls. Funding went towards the cost of training and uniforms.

SMASH

SMASH offers mentoring and activities to young people aged 9 – 19 years who are disadvantaged and falling short of reaching their potential. They support young people to build confidence and self-esteem, take on new challenges and broaden their horizons. Funding supported the costs of a volunteer recruitment campaign to provide more support to young people at risk of being involved in violence and drugs or those experiencing poor mental health and self-esteem.

Splits

Splitz is a well-established charitable which provides services for the traumatised victims, their dependent children, as well as the perpetrators of domestic abuse. This project funded intensive support over 8 sessions for 10 young people identified as in need through their TeenzTalk school project.
